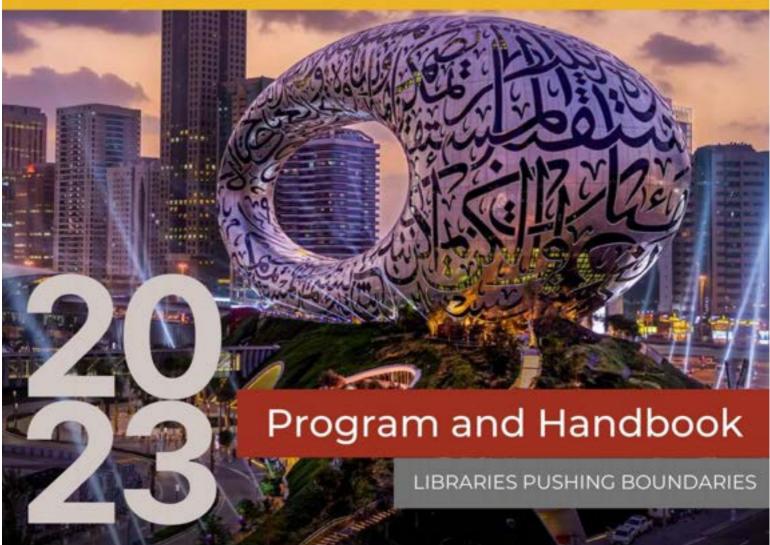
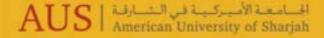

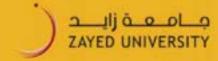

# **About IATUL**

### International Association of University Libraries (IATUL)

IATUL was founded in Düsseldorf, Germany, as the International Association of Technological University Libraries in May 1955, as an international forum for the exchange of ideas relevant to librarianship in technological universities throughout the world. IATUL is a voluntary international non-governmental organization of a group of libraries, represented by their library directors or senior managers, who have responsibility for information services and resources management.

The expanded name of IATUL was changed to the International Association of Scientific and Technological University Libraries at the 2009 General Assembly to reflect the broader range of institutions, which now make up the membership of the association. At the 2014 Annual Conference in Helsinki, the General Assembly of IATUL decided to extend its mandate to include all university libraries internationally, irrespective of their academic specialization. This change reflects the membership profile of IATUL where the vast majority of institutions now belong to comprehensive universities. Therefore, its name was changed to be the International Association of University Libraries.

IATUL is an excellent example of the development of an effective informal international network between libraries of similar type, with a common high level of professional expertise and offering a similar range of services to their users. Many of the members of IATUL provide services, not only to the teaching and research staff and students of their own university, but also to industrial organizations and national research institutions, in their respective countries.

The main objective of IATUL is to provide a forum where library directors and senior managers can meet to exchange views on matters of current significance and to provide an opportunity for them to develop a collaborative approach to solving problems. IATUL also welcomes organizations who supply services to university libraries into membership, if they wish to be identified with the association's activities

#### NICK POOLE



Nick is the Chief Executive of CILIP, where he works with the Board of Trustees and Presidential Team to set strategy and lead programmes to advance the interests of CILIP Members. Nick currently represents the sector on the Government Media Literacy Taskforce and holds the secretariat of the All-Party Parliamentary Group for Libraries, Information and Knowledge (APPG LiNK). Nick was previously Chair of Wikimedia UK, the UK chapter of the global Wikipedia Movement and is the former Chair of the Executive Board of BIC Ltd.

Nick has previously held roles in museums, central Government and corporate finance. He has been principal investigator on research-led programmes with a budget in excess of EUR110m and was for 7 years the UK representative to the European Commission.

He studied languages at University and holds postgraduate qualifications in Historical Linguistics from the University of Cambridge, Fine Art and Illustration from London University of the Arts and the History and Philosophy of Science from Birkbeck College.

#### SALLYANN DELLA CASA



As Founder and Chief Identity Hacker of GLEAC, Sallyann Della Casa is one of the 4% of women globally who has a patent-pending method and algorithm to signal and train agents in human skills. In 2016, she served as the only female at a C-suite level at Careem to help stabilize the workforce and shape its organizational culture. Careem was purchased by Uber for 3.1 b in Jan 2020.

On Oct 15th, 2022, she dropped the world's first NFT tokenizing industry experts time on and is building the first Metaverse Living Museum of Human wisdom with the NFT experts profiles (think Wikipedia in Metaverse and interactive).

A Harvard alum with degrees in Law, Organizational Behavior, and Urban Planning, Sallyann spends her days as the Founder of GLEAC, a mentorship and learning platform that shortens the distance between you and expertise. GLEAC powered the World Fair in Dubai, upskills African youth on the YOMA the Unicef Platform and also empowers learners on the JIO platfrom across India. Sallyann is also the Founder of the Growing Leaders Foundation.

#### UJALA SATGOOR



Ms Ujala Satgoor is the Executive Director: University of Cape Town Libraries since 2019. With over 25 years' experience, Ujala has fulfilled a leadership role on many national and international library and information services advisory and governing boards and committees during her career, which includes Board member: IATUL (2020-); Chair: Committee of Higher Education Libraries in South Africa (2018-2020); LIASA President (2012-2014); Co-Chair: 2015 IFLA WLIC National Committee; Member: AfLIA Governing Board; Member: IFLA Africa Section and Member: Council on Higher Education Library & Information Services Reference Group.

With several published papers, Ujala's experience includes library grant proposal writing and grants management, library leadership development and strategy formulation, and most recently, leading in times of crises including the UCT Jagger Library fire (2021). Ujala was named the first LIASA Executive Librarian of the Year in 2018.

#### AARON TAY



Aaron has been an academic librarian for over 10 years in Singapore and has worked in a variety of areas including library discovery, social media and bibliometrics. He is currently Lead, Data Services at the Singapore Management University Libraries. He has been honoured for his contributions to the profession with a few awards including Library Association of Singapore (LAS) Professional Service Award, Congress of Southeast Asian Libraries (CONSAL) award (Silver) and Pacific Rim Research Library Alliance (PRRLA) Karl Lo award.

He enjoys reading and thinking about the use of technology for academic users and regularly blogs his thoughts at the popular Musings about Librarianship since 2009.

#### AHLAM BOLOOKI



Ahlam is the Director of the Emirates Airline Festival of Literature - the Middle East's largest celebration of the written and spoken word. With a mission of inspiring all to read for pleasure, the festival is a platform for open dialogue, forward thinking and promotes a more empathetic society.

She is also the General Manager of ELF Publishing, the publishing house under the Emirates Literature Foundation umbrella with a mission to publish strong regional narrative that deserve to be read. Ahlam is the leader of the UAE Wikimedia User Group and founder of the Kateb Maktub movement which cultivates free information culture and enriches Arab authors data online.

#### ISOBEL ABULHOUL



Isobel Abulhoul came to Dubai in 1968 and co-founded Magrudy's, a bookshop chain, in 1975 which is still thriving and now has eleven bookshops across the UAE. In 2008 Isobel founded the international Emirates Airline Festival of Literature, the Middle East's largest award-winning celebration of the written and spoken word. In 2013, HH Sheikh Mohammed Bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Vice President and Prime Minister of the UAE and Ruler of Dubai, and also the Festival patron, issued a Decree establishing the Emirates Literature Foundation, naming Isobel as one of the trustees on the Board and holds the position of CEO. She is also a Trustee of the International Prize for Arabic Fiction Board, Secretary General of the Kalimat Foundation and a director of the Board for the Mohammed Bin Rashid Library. In addition, Isobel was elected to the Supreme National Committee for Tolerance and selected as member of the Police Advisory Council for Community Service. In September 2021, she was appointed as Chairperson for Global Council (Nexus Model).

Isobel has received several awards and accolades over the years such as Cultural Personality of the Year by Dr. HH Sheikh Sultan Bin Mohammed Al Qasimi, the Ruler of Sharjah in 2010, prestigious OBE award by HM Queen Elizabeth of Great Britain in 2012 and the Pioneer's Award in 2016 from HH Sheikh Mohammed Bin Rashid Al Maktoum. Isobel's passion and drive for education and literature remains as strong as ever

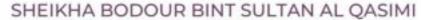
#### KHADIJA MUHSIN ALI



Khadija Muhsin Ali is the Manager of Library Services Section in Mohammed Bin Rashid Library. She holds a Master of Library Sciences from the American University in the Emirates and a Bachelor of Computer Information Technology Systems from Dubai University.

Khadija has over 30 years of experience and a long-standing career in the field of public libraries, bringing expertise acquired over the years through attending specialized regional and international conferences and exchanging expertise during her visits to various libraries in Europe and the Arab world. She further honed her skills by completing intensive training courses and attending book fairs, providing her with the necessary qualifications to plan the integration between public and school libraries, as well as prepare cultural events relevant to the objectives of each library.

Khadija was recognized by several prestigious awards, including first place of the Excellent Environmental Employee Award - Photography, by Dubai Culture; Leadership in Libraries by Dubai Culture; DEWA's Best Consumer Award; Excellent Reader Award, Dubai Police; Sharjah's Library Literature Award. Recently, Khadija received an Emirates Library and Information Association's (ELIA) Librarian Award.





Sheikha Bodour bint Sultan Al Qasimi, Chairperson of the Board of Trustees and President of the American University of Sharjah

In January 2023, Sheikha Bodour was appointed Chairperson of the Board of Trustees and President of the American University of Sharjah to align the institution with Sharjah's socio-economic, workforce, and innovation priorities. She is working to achieve excellence in teaching, research, and public service to develop global citizen graduates who become future leaders in their communities, the United Arab Emirates, and the world.

As Chairperson of the Sharjah Investment and Development Authority, Sheikha Bodour has mobilized more than \$4 billion in foreign direct investment, created more than 20,000 jobs, and contributed to a 78% growth in Sharjah's gross domestic product. Her work as Chairperson of Sharjah Entrepreneurship Center (Sheraa) is accelerating the development of Sharjah's entrepreneurship ecosystem and has supported 150 startups that have raised \$128 million in investment and created 1,400 jobs.

Sheikha Bodour established the Emirates Publishers Association, UAE Board on Books for Young People, and Knowledge Without Borders to boost the growth of the UAE's \$300+ million publishing sector. She founded Kalimat Publishing Group, a global, multi-imprint publishing and edtech company with licensing and distribution in 54 countries. She also chaired the Sharjah World Book Capital 2019 Committee, and led efforts to establish the Emirates Reprographic Rights Management Association.

Sheikha Bodour served as the International Publishers Association's second-ever female and first-ever Arab President since the influential global association's founding in 1896. She also founded Publisher, a 1,000+ member global community of female publishing leaders addressing publishing's diversity and inclusion challenges.

Sheikha Bodour is taking action on the world's most pressing challenges through her involvement in international organizations. She has leveraged these global platforms to catalyze action on youth education and employment, female entrepreneurship, small and medium-size enterprise development, expanding funding for the cultural industries, and climate change.

#### DIANE JOB



Diane Job is Director of Libraries and Learning Resources at The University of Birmingham, having previously worked at Imperial College London and City University, London. Soon after joining the University in 2009, Diane became involved in the University's ambitious and exciting new capital programme.

Managed by Diane's teams, the new Main Library and the new Teaching and Learning Building, sit side by side overlooking the "Green Heart" of campus.

Undoubtedly, both are aesthetically exceptional but crucially innovation in design was driven by a desire to enable continual service improvement and development. When the University embarked on the project for the Dubai campus, they were determined to build on the learning from the UK library project. Perhaps more importantly they were determined to embed a culture of learning, improvement and development that flows in both directions.
